To assist families who have a major residential fire with immediate needs of basic clothing and personal hygiene materials.

After the Fire

Recovering from a fire can be a physically and mentally draining process.

Volunteers in the community are reaching out at the fire scene to meet basic needs of basic clothing and personal hygiene materials.

The First 24 Hours

- Contact the local disaster relief service, such as the Red Cross, United Way or Salvation Army, for assistance with your basic immediate needs.
- Contact your insurance agent/company.
- Notify your mortgage company/landlord of the fire.
- Notify family, friends, and employers of your relocation.
- Notify your child’s school.
- Notify the post office of your relocation.

Cautions

- Do not enter the damaged site.
- Do not attempt to turn on utilities yourself. Your utilities have been cut off by the North Little Rock Fire Department for safety reasons
- Food, beverages and medicine exposed to the heat, smoke and water should not be consumed.
- Watch for damage to the structure.

If it is safe to do so, locate the following information:

- Identification-drivers license and social security card
- Insurance information
- Valuables, important papers and necessities
