The regular meeting of the North Little Rock City Council scheduled for Monday, December 8, 2008, was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by the honorable Mayor PATRICK HENRY HAYS. The roll having been called, and the following Aldermen answered to their names: NEIL BRYANT, DEBI ROSS, LINDA ROBINSON, OLEN THOMAS, CARY GAINES, JOHN PARKER and CHARLIE HIGHT (7/0). Alderman MURRY WITCHER was absent. City Clerk Diane Whitbey and City Attorney C. Jason Carter were also present.

The invocation was given by Alderwoman Ross, followed by the pledge of allegiance to the flag which was led by Alderman Bryant.

On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Parker, and by consent of all members present, the minutes of a regular council meeting held on Monday, November 24, 2008, were approved, accepted and filed as prepared by the City Clerk (7/0).

A blanket motion was made by Alderwoman Ross and seconded by Alderman Hight, to accept and file communications #1, 2, and 3.

On the motion of Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present, communication #1 was read by title only, accepted and filed (7/0).

1. Mayor Hays letter to City Council scheduling a public hearing for Monday, December 22, 2008, at 7:00 p.m. re: proposed approval of a Project Plan and the related combining of North Little Rock Redevelopment Districts 1, 4 and 5.

Mayor Hays advised legislation will be filed for the next council asking the council to approve combining the redevelopment (Tax Increment Financing) districts mentioned herein. A hotel is proposed for one of the properties. A parking deck could also be constructed. Mayor Hays has visited with Mr. Darryl Montgomery, President of the North Little Rock School Board and Mr. Ken Kirspel, Superintendent regarding the same.

On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderwoman Ross, and by consent of all members present, communication #2 was read by title only, accepted and filed (7/0).

Mayor Hays advised Mr. Robert Voyles, Planning Director has notified property owners in the area of the property (formerly Deluxe Video) verbally, and in writing. A notice was also run in the paper.

SPECIAL CALL #1 (ORDINANCE NO. 8121 - MAYOR HAYS)

AN ORDINANCE RECLASSIFYING CERTAIN PROPERTY LOCATED AT 9201 FAULKNER LAKE ROAD IN THE CITY OF NORTH LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS, FROM THE PRESENT I-2 TO I-3; AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 7697 OF THE CITY OF NORTH LITTLE ROCK, ARKANSAS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER

PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Thomas and seconded by Alderwoman Robinson, and by consent of all members present, the rules were suspended and the ordinance was placed on its second reading (7/0). On the motion of Alderman Thomas and seconded by Alderwoman Robinson, and by consent of all members present, the rules were again suspended and the ordinance was placed on its third and final reading (7/0). The ordinance was read a third and final time. Mayor Hays advised Rank Video leased the building while another company owned it. The proposed business will employ over 500 people with an annual payroll of one million dollars. If the property is not sold to a manufacturer of Land Use Motor Vehicles within 60 days, this ordinance will become void. Mayor Hays convened a public hearing. There being no one wishing to be heard, the public hearing was adjourned. On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Thomas, and the roll having been called, and all members present, having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was adopted (7/0). Emergency clause adopted (7/0).

Mayor Hays advised Dan and Cindy Daughtery are hosting visiting exchange students. Miss Ecem (a-gem) Mutlu is from Izmir, Turkey and a student at Central High School. She will be here for a few months. She was excited to see the flag from Turkey flying over the USS Razorback submarine. Another student from Rome, Italy, Miss Ludo Barbato is also visiting. Both thanked everyone for their hospitality.

Mayor Hays reconvened a public hearing regarding O-08-82, an ordinance adopting a parking regulations chapter as part of the North Little Rock Municipal Code; repealing certain code sections. Alderman Hight has talked to several residents from Ward 4 and other areas of the city who have asked if this could be a citywide regulation. He will proposed several amendments including deleting the section regarding parking districts. Mr. Carter said Section 4.3.1a is an optional rule, which could be changed to reflect city-wide. Alderman Hight also mentioned recreational vehicles and small trailers. Alderman Gaines requested the amendments be submitted to the council in writing so they will have time to review them before the next council meeting. Proposed amendments will be distributed in the council packets next week. Shawn Archer recently moved to Lakewood in North Little Rock. When looking for a home, a lot of considerations were made, including the appearance of the neighborhood. He sited a parking regulations from other areas. Celeste Archer grew up in North Little Rock. She left the area in 1979. Six months ago she moved back. She was saddened by the condition of some of the yards in the neighborhood. Some areas look like used car lots which takes away from property values. She and her husband both support the proposed parking regulation ordinance. Mr. Nathan Brandes asked about recreational vehicles. The 48 hour time frame allowed is not enough for people who work to adequately prepare their RV. He suggested allowing 72 hours to provide

adequate time to safely prepare and equip vehicles. This time frame is endorsed by Sam's Club and the Family Motor Coach Association. Alderman Hight asked that the city clerk provide minutes from approximately 6 years ago wherein parking may have been discussed. Mr. Carter said the 48 hour rule is in the current ordinance. Cary Tyson lives on North Magnolia supports this ordinance. He would hate to see it fail if it is made citywide. Lemoyne Jones asked how will a neighborhood be defined and if adopted, how will the ordinance be enforced? Alderman Hight said a neighborhood or parking district will be defined by the people who live there. A parking district could be as small as a block. There being no one else present wishing to be heard, the public hearing was recessed until Monday, December 22, 2008, at 7:05 p.m. The ordinance was then read. Alderwoman Robinson said all neighborhoods in the city are not equal. In Ward 2, some of the streets are very narrow. Parking in the street may restrict the passage of emergency vehicles. This legislation presents a hardship for some of the residents in Ward 2. Alderwoman Ross said parking districts would allow the areas that want it to have it, and those that don't want it wouldn't. Alderwoman Robinson said parking districts would be better than citywide regulations and she would support parking districts. Mr. Carter said Ward specific legislation is possible, however, there would be considerations and research would be required. Some residents are parking vehicles in their yard when they have paved surfaces where they could park. Alderwoman Ross asked about U-Haul type vehicles. Mr. Carter said moving type vehicles may not be a problem. There being no further discussion the legislation was then held by sponsors Aldermen Hight and Ross.

Mayor Hays announced Agenda Item Citizen Comment. Mr. David Sanders spoke regarding O-08-95. He lives at 2406 Division Street. An alley runs behind his property. A lot of undesirable people hang out in the area. The alley is a transient path between the Heritage House and shopping center. He has seen illegal activities there. This makes it unsafe for him to entertain family at his home.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

R-08-191 (RESOLUTION NO. 7371 - MAYOR HAYS)

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN EXTENSION OF THE CITY'S AGREEMENT WITH FINNEGAN AND ASSOCIATES FOR GRANT WRITING AND FUNDING SERVICES ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF NORTH LITTLE ROCK; APPROPRIATING FUNDS (\$30,000 - General Fund); AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. A motion to adopt was made by Alderwoman Robinson and seconded by Alderman Bryant. Alderwoman Ross asked if a report had been provided regarding grants the city has received as a result of the grant writers. Mr. Bob Sisson, Finance Director said a report was provided. Mr. Finnegan discussed several grants including the school district and the fire department. Alderwoman Ross asked the procedure on procuring a grant. Some grants require matching funds. Alderwoman Robinson said Finnegan and Associates has helped her in her ward and they have a good record with the city. On the previous motion, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was adopted (7/0).

Mr. Finnegan served in the Army and retired due to injuries. He appreciated what the exchange student from Turkey said regarding the USS Razorback. Finnegan and Associates is donating \$1,000.00 to AIMM to help them keep up their good work.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A PARKING REGULATIONS CHAPTER AS PART OF THE NORTH LITTLE ROCK MUNICIPAL CODE; REPEALING CERTAIN CODE SECTIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read one time on October 27, 2008, read a second time November 10, 2008, and read a third and final time, Monday, November 24, 2008. A public hearing was reconvened this date (see above). The public hearing was then recessed until Monday, December 22, 2008, at 7:05 p.m. The legislation was then held by its sponsors.

R-08-193 (RESOLUTION NO. 7372 - MAYOR HAYS)

A RESOLUTION REAPPOINTING TOM BROWN TO THE PLANNING COMMISSION BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT AND APPEALS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderwoman Ross, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was adopted (7/0). Mr. Brown and his wife, Faye were present. Mayor Hays acknowledged both of them and thanked them for their continued service to the city. Mr. Brown loves North Little Rock. He thanked the Mayor and council. Ms. Whitbey thanked Mr. Brown for driving her in the Christmas parade, as did Mayor Hays.

R-08-194 (RESOLUTION NO. 7373 - MAYOR HAYS)

A RESOLUTION REAPPOINTING JUDY WALLER TO THE NORTH LITTLE ROCK RESIDENTIAL HOUSING FACILITIES BOARD; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Gaines, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was adopted (7/0). Mayor Hays thanked Ms. Waller for her continued service to the city.

R-08-195 (RESOLUTION NO. 7374 - MAYOR HAYS)

A RESOLUTION REAPPOINTING WILLIAM CARTWRIGHT TO THE NORTH LITTLE ROCK RESIDENTIAL HOUSING FACILITIES BOARD; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderwoman Robinson, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was adopted (7/0).

R-08-196 (RESOLUTION NO. 7375 - MAYOR HAYS)

A RESOLUTION REAPPOINTING EARL HILL TO THE NORTH LITTLE ROCK RESIDENTIAL HOUSING FACILITIES BOARD; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Gaines, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was adopted (7/0).

R-08-197 (RESOLUTION NO. 7376 0 MAYOR HAYS)

A RESOLUTION APPROVING INCLUDING A 27TH PAY PERIOD IN FY 2008 FOR ALL NORTH LITTLE ROCK EMPLOYEES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. A motion to adopt was made by Alderwoman Robinson and seconded by Alderman Hight. Mr. Sisson said leap year added an extra day. This happens once every 10 years and is known as the "payroll creep". On the previous motion, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the resolution was adopted (7/0).

R-08-198 (RESOLUTION NO. 7377 - MAYOR HAYS)

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE LOW BID OF DIAMOND INTERNATIONAL FOR FOUR (4) REFUSE COLLECTION TRUCKS AND FIVE (5) KNUCKLEBOOM TRUCKS FOR THE NORTH LITTLE ROCK SANITATION DEPARTMENT; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO ENTER INTO A FINANCING AGREEMENT

(\$1,230,650.00 with a 4.47% not to exceed 5% interest rate, loan term 60 months); AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. A motion to adopt was made by Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderwoman Robinson. Mr. Sisson advised the money is in the budget for 2009. On the motion of Alderwoman Ross and seconded by Alderman Thomas, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was amended as follows: *Section 2: strike 4.47% and insert NOT TO EXCEED 5% (7/0)*. On the motion of Alderman Thomas and seconded by Alderwoman Robinson and by consent of all members present, the resolution was adopted as amended (7/0).

R-08-199 (RESOLUTION NO. 7378 - MAYOR HAYS)

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO EXECUTE A TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT TO ALLOW CONTAMINATION REMEDIATION ON THE KOPPERS SITE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. A

motion to adopt was made by Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Hight. Mr. Carter said this would allow a test well to be dug 100 feet below a city street. On the previous motion, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the resolution was adopted (7/0).

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR THE 2009 FISCAL YEAR FOR THE CITY OF NORTH LITTLE ROCK; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was called. A motion to suspend the rules was made. The ordinance was read. On

the motion of Alderman Bryant and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present the rules were suspended and the ordinance was placed on its second reading (7/0). The ordinance was read a second time. A public hearing will be held Monday, December 22, 2008 at 7:05 p.m. Mayor Hays said the proposed budget is similar to 2008 and is based on revenue projections for 2009. Several upcoming expenditures were discussed, including increased Health Insurance and extension of CATA bus services. GPS trackers for city vehicles would improve services. Alderwoman Ross asked about the River City Ministries appropriation of \$75,000.00, the Sister Cities program appropriation of \$25,000.00, Arts and Education - Little Rock Arts Center appropriation of \$40,000.00, Youth Programs - City Year, etc. Mayor Hays said the city engineer makes recommendations pertaining to the sidewalk program. Alderwoman Ross also asked about an \$80,000.00 appropriation to the airport for equipment. Mr. Sisson said the total budget is \$184 million, with the Electric Department being the largest portion of the budget. Alderman Parker asked about street overlay funds. Raises are not included in this budget. The ordinance was then held by the sponsor, Mayor Hays.

A motion to adopt was made by Alderman Thomas and seconded by Alderwoman Robinson. On the motion of Alderman Thomas and seconded by Alderman Bryant, the ordinance was amended as follows: *insert NEW Section 3: THIS WAIVER SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT FOR A PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS, AND WILL BECOME PERMANENT UPON SUBSTANTIAL PROGRESS TOWARD CONSTRUCTION OF THE PLANNED HOTEL DEVELOPMENT; and, renumber subsequent sections* (7/0). On the motion of Alderman Thomas and seconded by Alderman Bryant, and the roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was adopted as amended (7/0). Emergency clause adopted (7/0).

O-08-92 (ORDINANCE NO. 8124 - ALDERWOMAN ROBINSON)

was read. A motion to suspend the rules was made by Alderman Gaines and seconded by Alderman Parker. Mr. Voyles advised one property owner located at 2411 (which backs up to the alley) is opposed to this legislation. Mr. Carter referenced a case before the Arkansas Supreme Court in which the City of Monticello lost. On the previous motion, the rules were suspended and the ordinance was placed on its second reading (7/0). The ordinance was read a second time. The legislation was then held by the sponsor, Alderman Parker.

PUBLIC COMMENTS-----

Alderwoman Ross said volunteers are needed at WalMart on East McCain to assist with wrapping gifts for the Shop With A Cop Program. Anyone interested can either show up or call North Little Rock Police Officer Tommy Norman at 501-366-4330. Wrapped new toys are also needed for children ages 2 - 12. Mayor Hays said the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra Christmas

performance benefitting the Boys Clubs of Central Arkansas will be this Saturday, December 13, 2008 at North Little Rock East Campus. Mayor Hays discussed a recent article regarding President-elect Barack Obama's plans to stimulate the economy. Alderman Hight commended the North Little Rock Fire Department and Chief Joe McCall for their efforts in a fire last week on Interstate 40. Captain Mike Davis, North Little Rock Police Department talked about the upcoming Polar Bear Plunge Fundraiser for Special Olympics which will be this Saturday at noon at Lakewood Lake #3. A Super Plunge commence at noon on Friday and continue every hour (on the hour) through noon on Saturday. Mayor Hays volunteered to plunge on Saturday and challenged all Arkansas Mayors to join him in the plunge.
