The regular meeting of the North Little Rock City Council scheduled for Monday, May 24, 2010, was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by the honorable Mayor PATRICK HENRY HAYS. The roll having been called, and the following Aldermen answered to their names: DEBI ROSS, BETH WHITE, MAURICE TAYLOR, LINDA ROBINSON, SAM BAGGETT, JIMMY PHILLIPS, CHARLIE HIGHT and MURRY WITCHER (8/0), a quorum was declared. Assistant City Clerk Linda Marshall and City Attorney, C. Jason Carter were also present.

The invocation was given by Alderwoman White, followed by the pledge of allegiance to the flag which was led by Alderwoman Ross .

On the motion of Alderman Witcher, and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present, the minutes of a regular council meeting and a Special Call meeting held on Monday, May 10, 2010, were approved, accepted and filed as prepared by the City Clerk (8/0).

On the blanket motion of Alderman Taylor and seconded by Alderman Robinson, and by consent of all members present, communications # 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7, were accepted and filed (8/0).

Communication # 1 was read, accepted and filed.

1. Charlie Knott, President Northeast Lakewood Associated Neighborhood - email re: 10 year permit period for Electronic Changeable Copy Signs.

On the motion of Alderman Hight, and seconded by Alderwoman Ross, and by consent of all members present, Communication #2 was read, accepted and filed.

2. Jo Melton email re: amended sign ordinance #7967 support ban of electronic changeable copy signs.

On the motion of Alderman Hight, and seconded by Alderman Witcher, and by consent of all members present,

Communication #8 was read, accepted and filed.

8. Nathan Brandes email re: Ordinance 10-35, ECCS (Electronic Changeable Copy Signs): Mayor's amendment and Pole signs.

Mayor Hays invited Ms. Terry Kessinger, North Little Rock Electric Department to come forward. Through the Energy Efficiency Block Grant Program, numerous energy efficiency programs have been established. Ms. Kessinger presented a check in the amount of \$500.00 to Ms. Kay Mueller, L'Oreal Environmental Engineer, L'Oreal in recognition of the company changing lights to energy efficient ones. Mayor Hays said he recently visited the L'Oreal plant and learned about a program known as HEAL (Home Energy Affordable Loans) which allows L'Oreal employees to borrow money (up to \$2000.00) for energy saving home improvements. Once the loan is repaid, other employees can borrow through payroll deductions. Mayor Hays announced that sales tax collections are up for the first time in 20 months. Alderwoman White said L'Oreal employees painted the ironwork and the Old Mill and thanked them for their community involvement. Ms. Kessinger said Mr. Wayne Hogan, Galaxy Furniture is in the process of changing lights and will also receive a rebate check through the grant.

Mayor Hays convened a public hearing regarding O-10-36, establishing the Overbrook Restricted Parking District. There being no one present wishing to be heard, the public hearing was adjourned.

Without objection O-10-36 was called.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE OVERBROOK RESTRICTED PARKING  
DISTRICT; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read three times May 24, 2010. A public hearing was convened this date (see above). The ordinance was read. On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Witcher, and by consent of all members present, the ordinance was amended as follows: *attach map as requested by Alderwoman Ross* (8/0). On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present, the ordinance was unanimously adopted as amended (8/0). Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0).

### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

O-10-35 (ORDINANCE NO. 8261 - MAYOR HAYS)  
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 7697 ("THE ZONING ORDINANCE")  
TO RESTRICT THE PLACEMENT OF NEW ELECTRONIC CHANGEABLE COPY SIGNS  
TO CERTAIN DISTRICTS WITHIN THE CITY; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND

FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read three times, amended and held on May 10, 2010. The ordinance was read. A motion to adopt as previously amended was made by Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Baggett. Mr. Carter briefly reviewed the amendments made May 10, 2010. Mayor Hays asked if anyone wished to speak regarding this legislation. Mr. Robert Fureigh said North Little Rock should be a "Progressive City." Most small business owners would prefer not to have the expense of an electronic sign. Mr. Knott asked that the council protect neighborhoods and property values. All of these signs should be restricted to overlay districts. He referenced a traffic report he received. High traffic areas with the highest number of accidents included Landers and McCain with the highest number, Warden Road and McCain which ranked third and Fairway and McCain which was eighth. Mr. Brandes thanked the six aldermen who invited him to go with them to look at signs. He suggested eliminating references to frequency in the ordinance. There are 27 whereas in this ordinance. The safety factor is important. He asked the council to extend the moratorium for an additional two weeks. Ms. Faye Kirkwood spoke regarding several distractions before drivers today. During World War II, flashing lights were used as a form of torture and asked if this was what we want for citizens. There being no one else who signed up to speak, Mayor Hays said his intent was to call this item for a vote this date and that amendments could be made at the next two meetings before this legislation takes effect (July 1, 2010). Alderman Hight said the moratorium date keeps being extended. Mayor Hays said the moratorium would have to be extended if the effective date is changed until July 1, 2010. Mayor Hays recommended proposed amendments individually. On the motion of Alderwoman Ross and seconded by Alderwoman White, and by consent of all members present, the ordinance was amended as follows:: *Section 4: H., add SIGN PERMITS MAY BE RENEWED ANNUALLY BY SUBMISSION OF THE APPROPRIATE FEE WITH RENEWAL OF A CITY PRIVILEGE (OR BUSINESS) LICENSE (8/0)*. On the motion of Alderwoman Ross and seconded by Alderwoman White, and by consent of all members present, the ordinance was again amended as follows:: *Section 6: insert E. NO NEW ELECTRONIC CHANGEABLE COPY SIGN MAY BE ILLUMINATED UNTIL IT HAS BEEN INSPECTED BY AN APPROPRIATE CITY OFFICIAL AND CERTIFIED TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH CITY ORDINANCE. A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE DEEMED CONTINUOUS IN NATURE AND PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50) NOR MORE THAN FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500) PER DAY. THIS SECTION SHALL NOT APPLY TO SUCH ILLUMINATION THAT IS REASONABLY NECESSARY TO VERIFY PROPERTY INSTALLATION, PROPERTY FUNCTION, OR COMPLIANCE WITH CITY ORDINANCES (8/0)*. A motion to amend was made by Alderwoman Ross and seconded by Alderwoman White, as follows:: *Section 10: H. SECTION 14.101 - CAMP ROBINSON/PIKE/REMOUNT ROAD SIGN OVERLAY DISTRICT. RATE OF CHANGE. DUE TO THE PROXIMITY OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY WITHIN THIS DISTRICT, THE LAYOUT OF EXISTING STREETS WITHIN THE DISTRICT, AND SAFETY CONCERNS OF THE CITY, ELECTRONIC CHANGEABLE COPY SIGNS WITHIN THIS DISTRICT SHALL NOT CHANGE MORE FREQUENTLY THAN ONCE DURING ANY FORTY-FIVE (45) MINUTE PERIOD*, the following members voted yes: White and Ross, and the following members voted no: Taylor, Robinson, Baggett, Phillips, Hight and Witcher, the motion failed (2/6). A motion to amend was made by Alderwoman Ross and seconded by Alderwoman White, as follows:: *Section 10: H. EXTEND FREQUENCY FROM 15 SECONDS TO 1 MINUTE*, the following members voted yes: Ross, White and Robinson, and

the following members voted no: Taylor, Baggett, Phillips, Hight and Witcher, the motion failed (3/5). Alderman Hight referenced the Camp Robinson District. Mr. Carter clarified the proposed legislation is for additional rules for existing districts. A motion to amend was made by Alderwoman Ross and seconded by Alderwoman White, as follows:: *Section 15: Section 14.107 - East McCain Sign Overlay District strike through North Hills Boulevard and insert SPRINGHILL ROAD*, and the following members voted yes: White, Ross and Robinson, and the following members voted no: Taylor, Baggett, Phillips, Hight and Witcher, the motion failed (3/5). On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Witcher, and by consent of all members present, with the exception of Alderwomen Ross, White and Robinson, the ordinance was amended as follows:: *add a new sign district with the same conditions as the East McCain Sign Overlay District...which would include NORTH HILLS BOULEVARD FROM MCCAIN BOULEVARD TO CRESTWOOD* (5/3). On the motion of Alderwoman Ross and seconded by Alderman Taylor, and by consent of all members present, the ordinance was again amended as follows:: *page 4, Section 1 remove underlined text (from amended version May 10, 2010)* (8/0). A motion to amend was made by Alderwoman White and seconded by Alderwoman Ross, as follows:: *Section 5: J. reduce 25% to 10%*, and the following members voted yes: Ross and White, and the following members voted no: Taylor, Robinson, Baggett, Phillips, Hight, and Witcher, the motion failed (2/6). On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present, the ordinance was again amended as follows:: *insert new Section : THE MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS BY THE NORTH LITTLE ROCK DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY PLANNING FOR ELECTRONIC CHANGEABLE COPY SIGNS ESTABLISHED BY RES. NO. 7453 AND EXTENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 8194, 8219, 8222, 8226, AND 8256, IS HEREBY EXTENDED UNTIL AND SHALL TERMINATE ON JULY 1, 2010, and the Emergency (new SECTION 19:) is amended as follows:: Section ~~18~~ 20: strike through ~~from and after its passage and approval~~ and insert ON JULY 1, 2010* (8/0). On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight, and by consent of all members present, the ordinance was unanimously adopted as amended (8/0).

Mayor Hays recessed the meeting at 8:50 p.m. The meeting was reconvened at 8:55 p.m.

**R-10-67 (RESOLUTION NO.7644 - MAYOR HAYS)**

**A RESOLUTION DECLARING CERTAIN BUILDINGS, HOUSES AND OTHER STRUCTURES LOCATED AT 1512 EAST 2<sup>ND</sup> STREET IN THE CITY OF NORTH LITTLE ROCK TO CONSTITUTE A PUBLIC NUISANCE AND CONDEMNING SAID STRUCTURES; PROVIDING A PERIOD OF TIME FOR PROPERTY OWNERS TO ABATE SAID NUISANCE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES,** was read. A motion to adopt was made by Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Baggett. Mayor Hays convened a public hearing. Mr. Saeidi's son said he hired a contractor and has been working on the house since last Thursday. The contractor said he has a few more days of work on the house. He requested additional time to complete the work. Mr. Cedric Williams, Code Enforcement inspected the property. There are concerns about safety of the structure and the electrical work. There being

no one else wishing to be heard, the public hearing was adjourned. On the previous motion, and by consent of all members present, the resolution was unanimously adopted (8/0). Mayor Hays advised Mr Saeidi's son that he can meet with the City Attorney at Code Enforcement to make rehabilitation arrangements. (*owner: Taj Ali Saeidi*)

A RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE TERM OF THE CURRENT CURBSIDE RECYCLING AGREEMENT UNTIL SEPTEMBER 30, 2011; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. A motion to adopt was made by Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Witcher. Mayor Hays advised of a slight increase in the monthly fee. Alderman Hight asked if the increase would be more than the maximum allowed in the contract. Mr. Bob Sisson, Finance Director said this is beyond the current contract. Mayor Hays said the difference is 8 cents. On the previous motion, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the resolution was unanimously adopted (8/0).

R-10-72 (RESOLUTION NO. 7648 - MAYOR HAYS)

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE LOW BID OF TOWNSHIP BUILDERS, INC., FOR

AN ORDINANCE WAIVING FORMAL BIDDING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROVISION OF EMPLOYEE HEALTH AND WELLNESS SERVICES; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Hight, and seconded by Alderwoman Robinson, and by consent of all members present, the rules were suspended and the ordinance was placed on its second reading (8/0). On the motion of Alderman Taylor and seconded by Alderman Baggett, and by consent of all members present, the rules were again suspended and the ordinance was placed on its third and final reading (8/0). The ordinance was read a third and final time. Mr. Joe Smith, Director of Commerce and Government Affairs advised UAMS has managed the city's Wellness Clinic for several years. During that time there has been a lot of transition in management. Debra Velez worked with employees for ten years at the Wellness Clinic before leaving to start her own business. She had a great working relationship with employees. Alderwoman Robinson asked if the location of services would be in Little Rock. Mr. Smith said she does have a Little Rock address, however the City Employee Wellness Clinic will remain at its current location in the Willow House. She will provide services to the residents of Willow House as well. The roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was unanimously adopted (8/0). Mayor Hays welcomed Debbie back. Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0).

O-10-39 (ORDINANCE NO. 8263 - MAYOR HAYS)

AN ORDINANCE WAIVING FORMAL BIDDING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF TWO TRANSFORMERS FOR THE NEW GALLOWAY SUBSTATION; APPROPRIATING FUNDS (\$912,862.00 + the additional amount of \$22,600.00 for on-site assembly, processing and testing - Electric O&M Fund); DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Phillips, and by consent of all members present, the rules were suspended and the ordinance was placed on its second reading (8/0). On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Baggett, and by the consent of all members present, the rules were again suspended and the ordinance was placed on its third and final reading (8/0). Mr. Bob Reynolds, Systems Electrical Engineer for North Little Rock Electric Department said there were 12 bidders on this transformer. The lowest bidder did not have the technology or the ability to fulfil the request. To verify this, a site visit was made. On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Baggett, and the roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was unanimously adopted (8/0). Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0).

O-10-40 (ORDINANCE NO. 8264 - MAYOR HAYS)

AN ORDINANCE WAIVING FORMAL BIDDING REQUIREMENTS FOR PURCHASE OF A RECONDITIONED TUB GRINDER AT THE MURRAY HYDRO PLANT;

APPROPRIATING FUNDS (\$380,000.00 - Electric O&M Fund); DECLARING AND EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, was read. On the motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Witcher, and by consent of all members present, the rules were suspended and the ordinance was placed on its second reading (8/0). On motion of Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Taylor, and by consent of all members present, the rules were again suspended and the ordinance was placed on its third and final reading (8/0). The ordinance was read a third and final time. Mr. Reynolds said the city received a grant around the first of the year. Debris has been burned in the past. A grinder can produce manageable chips. He said that after an extensive search for new and used grinders, he felt it was in the best interest of the city to buy a reconditioned grinder. This particular grinder has a 60 day machine warranty and two (2) years on the engine warranty. On the motion of Alderman Witcher and seconded by Alderman Hight, and the roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was unanimously adopted (8/0). Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0). A motion to name the tub grinder the "Big Dam Grinder" was made by Alderman Hight and seconded by Alderman Phillips, and the following members voted yes: Taylor, Baggett, Phillips and Hight, and the following members voted no: Ross, White, Robinson and Witcher (Mayor Hays did not vote), the motion failed (4/4).

On the motion of Alderwoman Robinson and seconded by Alderman Taylor, and by consent of all members present, the rules were again suspended and the ordinance was placed on its third and final reading (8/0). The roll having been called, and all members present having voted in the affirmative, the ordinance was unanimously adopted (8/0). Emergency clause unanimously adopted (8/0). #### **PUBLIC COMMENTS-----**

Alderman Hight thanked everyone for their e-mails, cards and calls following his recent surgery. Alderman Taylor said Baring Cross is having a clean up day June 12, starting at the Salvation Army building. Alderman Phillips commended Code Enforcement for their work on condemnations. Alderman Witcher encouraged everyone to read the Patrick Henry Hays Senior Citizens Center's Annual Report for 2009. It is one of the best centers in both the public and private sector. Mayor Hays said the center is what it is thanks to the hard work of the staff and

the many volunteers. A Volunteer Appreciation luncheon was held at the center recently and well attended. Our volunteers logged in well over 32,498 hours. Mayor Hays encouraged elected officials to attend the Arkansas Municipal League Conference in Hot Springs, June 16 - 18, 2010, at which time Alderman Murry Witcher will be sworn in as the league president. Alderman Baggett asked about zoning at the old Baptist Hospital property. Mr. Smith advised it has been sold and the buyer has until 2011 to take down the old tower. The owner will have to come to the city for zoning before they can operate any type of business at the site. Alderman Phillips attended several graduation exercises and was amazed at the amount of scholarships given to many of the graduates. Mr. Knott thanked Mayor Hays and council members for taking the lead on electronic signs. Mr. Fred Norman said his biking group is sponsoring a bike ride from North Little Rock to Birmingham, Alabama on Saturday June 5, 2010, and asked permission to contact Mrs. Margaret Powell for assistance in getting information out to the public. Alderman Hight said he forwarded the flier to Arkansas Bike Club. He will not be able to participate because there is a bike ride scheduled for that weekend in McGehee. His group will do all they can to promote the event for Mr. Norman. Mr. James Ard said Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. the North Little Rock Veteran's Memorial Committee will meet and continue to take names of those to be honored. A live radio broadcast will take place on Thursday at My Friend's Place at 3:00 p.m. Bricks are for sale for this memorial. Alderwoman Ross said the Veteran's Memorial Committee will meet at the Community Center and is collecting names for memorial. Donations are still being accepted. Mr. Steve Baxter is the Vice President of the Amboy Neighborhood Association. He invited everyone to come by Military Drive to see the landscaping they have done. Mr. Baxter also thanked the city for all of its help. Mr. Bobby Taylor asked to speak with Mayor Hays after the meeting regarding an issue he had discussed with him.
